DAY 1 »

Halifax, Peggy's Cove, and Lunenburg

Your Nova Scotia adventure begins in the vibrant port city of Halifax. Here, you meet your expert local guide for an immersive two-hour walk of hidden gems known only to locals. As you stroll along cobblestone streets, you discover the city's rich maritime heritage and colorful past. Your walk culminates with a visit to the iconic Citadel Hill, offering panoramic views of the harbor.

From Halifax, embark on a scenic coastal drive to the picturesque fishing village of Peggy's Cove. A leisurely walk along the rugged coastline leads to the famous lighthouse. Your guide regales you with tales of the lighthouse's history and its crucial role in maritime safety. Your journey continues to the UNESCO World Heritage town of Lunenburg.

DAY 2 »

Lunenburg and The Ovens

This morning, step back in time as you join a local historian for a captivating walking tour of Lunenburg. You'll wander through narrow streets lined with colorful 18th and 19th-century buildings, learning about the town's seafaring past and unique architecture. Lunenburg's distinct "Bump" dormers and ornate Victorian details tell the story of prosperous fishing and shipbuilding eras. After some free time to explore and enjoy lunch at one of the quaint local eateries, you'll embark on a scenic drive to The Ovens Natural Park.

At The Ovens, you'll experience a breathtaking sea cliff walk, marveling at the rugged coastline and sea caves. Your guide will point out the diverse flora and fauna unique to this coastal ecosystem, from hardy sea grasses to nesting seabirds. As the afternoon sun begins to lower, return to Lunenburg for a truly special experience – a private sail aboard the Eastern Star. Feel the salt spray on your face as you glide across Lunenburg's harbor, taking in views of the town from a perspective few visitors ever see. Your captain will share stories of the area's rich maritime history as you watch for seals and porpoises in the bay.

DAY 3 »

Mahone Bay to Wolfville

Today, you'll journey from Lunenburg to the heart of Nova Scotia's wine country. Your first stop is the charming town of Mahone Bay, where you'll have an exclusive opportunity to interact with local artisans. Join a pewter craftsman in their workshop, trying your hand at this traditional skill that has been part of Nova Scotia's heritage for generations.

As you arrive in the Annapolis Valley, you'll be treated to a unique experience at a local vineyard. Join the winemaker for a private walk through the sun-drenched vineyards, learning about the region's unique terroir. The valley's microclimate, influenced by the Bay of Fundy tides and sheltered by North Mountain, creates ideal conditions for cool-climate varietals. Your visit culminates with a wine tasting lunch featuring perfectly paired local cuisine, followed by a behind-the-scenes tour of the winemaking process.

End your day at an elegant historic inn, once a sea captain's home dating back to the 1800s. Dinner tonight showcases the valley's finest ingredients, perhaps featuring Annapolis Valley apple-glazed pork tenderloin or locally caught Digby scallops, paired with the region's award-winning wines.

DAY 4 »

Wolfville to Annapolis Royal

Begin your day with an invigorating walk along the historic dykelands, an engineering marvel created by Acadian settlers centuries ago. As you traverse these fertile lands, your guide will share stories of the innovative farming techniques that allow for the cultivation of a wide variety of crops, from traditional apple orchards to new vineyards and even exotic fruits like kiwis.

Next, you'll visit the charming fishing village of Halls Harbour. Here, you'll have the rare opportunity to walk on the ocean floor during low tide, experiencing the world's highest tides in the Bay of Fundy. Your guide will explain the massive tidal fluctuations that expose up to 50 feet of shoreline twice daily. After your tidal walk, enjoy a traditional lobster lunch at a local restaurant. Watch as your fresh-caught lobster is prepared and learn the art of cracking and eating this Nova Scotian delicacy.

After lunch, continue your journey to Annapolis Royal. Stroll through this historic town, known as the "First Capital of Canada," and explore its extraordinary botanical gardens. Enjoy wandering through unique shops and art galleries before dinner on your own.

DAY 5 »

Brier Island and the Bay of Fundy

Today promises an unforgettable maritime adventure. Board a custom-built whale watching vessel designed for stability and unobstructed viewing, for an exhilarating excursion in the Bay of Fundy. The ship's experienced crew will help you spot and identify humpback whales, fin whales, and playful dolphins as your expert guide shares insights about the bay's unique ecosystem.

After crossing to Brier Island, you'll enjoy lunch at a cozy local lodge before embarking on a hike to Seal Cove. Here, witness massive harbor seals in their natural habitat – a sight few travelers ever experience.

Your island exploration continues with a visit to the Joshua Slocum Monument, honoring the first person to sail single-handedly around the world. On your return journey, stop to see the Digby Scallop fleet and visit a replica of folk artist Maud Lewis's house, gaining insight into Nova Scotia's rich cultural tapestry. From Mi'kmaq artistry to Acadian traditions and Scottish influences, you'll discover the diverse heritage that shapes this unique corner of Canada.

Port Royal and Farewell

On your final morning, step back to the early days of European settlement in North America with a visit to Port Royal. As you bid farewell to Nova Scotia, you'll carry with you memories of windswept coastlines, rolling vineyards, and the warm hospitality of Canada's ocean playground. Your journey back to Halifax is filled with scenic vistas and one last chance to reflect on the unique experiences and connections you've made in this captivating maritime province.
